SELECTION PROCESS:

Please submit applications to Ford County SWCD 1380 W. Ottawa Rd, Paxton, IL 60957. Applications will be accepted from students until **March 7, 2025**. Applications must be complete and accompanied by the Application Form, Transcript, and Letters of Recommendation. The Ford County Soil & Water Conservation Board shall review all applications and select the student to be awarded the Ford County SWCD Scholarship. Winner will be notified early May or at school's award ceremony.

Any student who is currently a high school senior and will be enrolled in an agricultural program for the 2024-2025 academic year at any college (junior college or four-year university) in Illinois is eligible.

To be eligible a student must:

- 1. Be a high school senior soon to be enrolled at any Illinois College in agriculture.
- 2. Be a resident of Ford County.
- 3. Have a grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale OR a 4.0 on a 5.0 scale.
- 4. Submit a copy of their latest transcript.
